



Owego Apalachin CSD - Remote Learning

Remote Learning

The District reopening plan for the 2020-2021 school year provides a continuity of learning for students whether they are engaged with in-person, hybrid, or fully remote models of instruction. The district's plan was designed to provide the ability to rapidly switch an individual student, a specific cohort of students, or the entire district from in-person or hybrid to fully remote. Teachers will configure lesson materials, student assignments, and supports so they can be accessed by students through in-person, synchronous remote, and asynchronous remote instructional models.

All students in grades UPK through 6 have the option to attend school, in person, Monday-Friday. Students in grades 7-12 will have the option to either attend school on a hybrid schedule (2 days per week in school, 3 days per week remote).

All K-12 families will have the option of choosing remote learning for their children. (There is NO remote learning option for UPK.)

Grades K-6

Families who choose remote learning for their students will be provided with all materials necessary for instruction as well as regular and substantive daily interaction with each student. Interaction will include direct instruction, active learning, checks for understanding, and meaningful and timely feedback on all assignments. Students will be assigned to a classroom teacher and will be given a remote schedule to follow. Live, interactive instruction with their teacher and classmates will occur daily.

Grades 7-12

Remote days will include regular and substantive daily interaction.

Families who choose remote learning for their students will be provided with all materials necessary for instruction as well as regular and substantive daily interaction with classmates and teachers. Interaction will include direct instruction, active learning, checks for understanding, and meaningful and timely feedback on all assignments. Hybrid instruction will include substantive daily instruction with daily attendance taken. Learning opportunities will be provided through livestream, Zoom, and assignments provided via our Learning Management System, Schoology.

Remote learning/technology information:



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- The District will provide 1:1 iPads for all K-12 students and staff.
- The District has purchased hot spots to meet the needs of students and staff without the internet where this option is viable.
- The District has outdoor access points that will allow connectivity to students and staff around all school buildings as well as additional locations off-campus.
- All District teachers will provide multiple ways for students to participate in learning and demonstrate mastery of Learning Standards in remote or hybrid models, especially if all students do not yet have sufficient access to high-speed internet.
- Teachers will post assignments on Google Classroom for grades K-3 and Schoology for grades 4-12.
- Lesson design will utilize the same best practices as in person lessons, including clear outcomes, engagement, questioning, and assessment with timely and targeted student feedback.
